

HSC Results

The community of St.Leo's Catholic College extend their congratulations to Year 12 2007 for their excellent HSC results despite the adversity that impacted on this year group with the loss of 2 dear friends.

The year group conducted themselves with maturity and selflessness and were a credit to their family and college.

The College had 28 appearances in the Distinguished Achievers' list with the following subjects being represented: Biology, Business Studies, Design & Technology, Economics, Advanced English , Extension English 1 , Legal Studies , General Maths, Maths Extension 1, Music 1, PDHPE, Studies of Religion 1 & 2.

The highest U.A.I. with 97.85 was Daniel O'Hara followed by Emma Baynie with 96.4 and Emilie Aitken with 95.45.

Approximately 24 students scored a U.A.I. of 80 or more with students accessing a variety of courses in the Humanities and Sciences at the University of Sydney, NSW, UTS Macquarie and Newcastle.

In addition there was a decrease in the number of Bands 1 & 2 awarded from previous years and an increase in the number of Bands 3 & 4 indicating that our staff are seeing the results of our focus on the Quality Teaching Framework approach to our teaching and the students themselves are understanding what is needed to achieve at the higher levels in the HSC course.

Daniel O'Hara gained entry into Medicine , Emma Baynie into Bachelor of Science(Nutrition) at Sydney University and Emilie Aitken into Bachelor of Law at Macquarie.

St.Leo's is a Partnership School in the Macquarie University program which results in our students being awarded an additional 5 U.A.I. points towards any courses they choose. This is a considerable bonus for our students and one that they are taking advantage of.

On the 25th February at 8.30 all students that we are aware of who gained a U.A.I. of 80 or over have been invited back to be presented to the whole college at our Principal's assembly and then to a morning tea.
